Stay safe when using a live tree this Christmas season

any people choose live trees in their homes at Christmas, and while this tradition adds to the season's magic, it also increases the risk of house fires.

To protect your family, choose the freshest tree possible. Select a tree with green needles that do not fall off when touched. Other warning signs of a drying tree are discolored foliage, musty odors and wrinkled bark.

You can double check the freshness by running a branch through your enclosed hand. The needles should not come off easily. When you bend the outer branches, the limbs should be pliable. If the branches are brittle and snap easily, the tree could be a fire hazard.

When you get home, you can improve the tree's water intake-and

make it harder to catch fire—by cutting about a 1/2 inch of wood from the trunk base before putting it in the stand. Do not cut at an angle or V-shape because that reduces the amount of water available to the tree. As a general rule, tree stands should provide one quart of water per inch of the trunk's diameter. Check the stand daily to ensure the water level doesn't go below the base of the tree.

An additional safeguard is to place the tree away from sources of heat such as fireplaces, space heaters and vents.

When it comes to decor, use low-heat lights such as LEDs. Inspect the lights for broken or cracked sockets, frayed or bare wires, or loose connections before use. Always turn the lights off before leaving the house or going to bed.

Wrapping up 2021

Showing "concern for the community" is an operating principle we honor all year long while delivering safe, reliable, affordable electricity. We also express our dedication through special programs and initiatives meant to improve the quality of

life for our members.

- Our dedicated team of lineworkers maintained the co-op's 3,950 miles of line, while co-op employees worked behind the scenes, to ensure the reliable delivery of electricity to members' homes and businesses.
- Aid from fellow electric cooperatives from Kentucky and other states helped us restore service after a February ice storm caused widespread damage to our system.
- A nimbleness allowed us to safely hold our annual member meeting, an essential component of a member-owned and controlled cooperative. This year's drive-thru meeting attracted 516 registrants.
- Eligible members shared over 140,000 in capital credits, a welcome windfall to many.
- The high-tech tools that Kentucky's Touchstone Energy Cooperatives had in place enabled us to work closely



with site selectors, businesses and government leaders to help bring \$7 billion in investments and over 15,000 jobs to Kentucky since 2015.

- Our power supplier unveiled a sustainability plan that includes strategies for increasing fuel diversity, decreasing carbon emissions and promoting environmental stewardship—all to ensure the resiliency of our electric distribution system.
- Programs such as Cooperative Solar and envirowatts gave members renewable energy options.
- \$8,000 in scholarships were awarded to deserving students in the co-op's service area, allowing them to continue their education after high school graduation.
- We again sponsored Kentucky's Special Olympics Summer Games, which attracted more than 1,000 special athletes and 500 volunteers, including employees from Inter-County Energy.

When you gather with family and friends this holiday season, remember to reflect on the wonderful gifts that don't come packaged in pretty paper and bows. I hope you'll count your membership in Inter-County Energy among them.
