#### **MEMBER SUPPORT**


As a cooperative, Inter-County Energy is your consumer advocate, speaking up for commonsense policies that promote reliable power as cost-effectively as possible.

As a consumer advocate, Inter-County Energy is a clearinghouse for reliable information about matters that affect your bill and electric service, such as the rising costs for fuels used to create electricity, energy efficiency ideas to help manage your costs, and protecting the sales tax exemption for utility services at primary residences. We have tools available on our website and member portal to conduct online energy audits as well as information on our Levelized Billing and PrePay Metering Programs.

#### ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

In partnership with Kentucky's Touchstone Energy Cooperatives, Inter-County Energy supports local businesses and works to attract new employers. Leading up to 2022, Inter-County Energy worked to bring more jobs and tourism to Lebanon and Marion counties by assisting Diageo-North America with its electric needs. In addition, a new distillery announced it is locating to the same area and has already done prep work on the new site.

We continue to work with existing businesses to assist them in expansion plans that will eventually add more jobs that benefit the local communities. With some of the most competitive electric rates in the country and our record of reliability and resilience, we have a great story to tell.




## **How Americans Use Electricity**
