# **Get paid to be smart**

eing smart has never been so simple. If you recently purchased a qualifying smart thermostat, you may be eligible for a \$100 credit from Inter-County Energy.

Your local Touchstone Energy Cooperative has partnered with several thermostat manufacturers, including Nest, Honeywell, ecobee and others. Once you've registered your qualifying smart thermostat online, you'll receive an email from the manufacturer about enrolling in the SimpleSaver program.

If you meet the requirements and enroll in SimpleSaver, you are eligible for a \$100 rebate.\* Plus, there's a \$10 one-time enrollment incentive. Each year you continue in the program, you'll receive an additional \$20 bill credit after the summer season.

"Your participating is risk-free," says Dan Hitchcock, vice president of Member Services. "It's a great way to reduce energy demand, but not your comfort."

When you sign up for the program, your thermostat will be adjusted a limited number of times throughout the summer. Here's how it works:

• At the start of an adjustment period, your thermostat will be automatically adjusted up to four degrees above the current temperature.

• The adjustment will typically last no more than four hours on non-holiday weekdays and will occur between 1 p.m. and 7 p.m.

 Once the temperature adjustment is over, your thermostat will return to its normal set point and/ or schedule. In some cases, your thermostat may be adjusted by up to three degrees prior to an adjustment event to pre-cool your home.

Those minor thermostat adjustments help us all work together to reduce energy use during peak demand times. And at any time during one of the events, you can opt out from your thermostat, mobile

device or web app. For the majority of the devices, when you opt out of the pre-cool,

you are also opting out of the temperature adjustment.

\*Eligibility requires being a member of one of the 15 participating local Touchstone Energy Cooperatives who uses an eligible, fixed internet-connected thermostat for cooling. The \$100 credit is available for qualifying thermostats that were purchased on or after March 2, 2019. See website for complete details.

# Safety Matters

# Play it safe with electricity at home

lectricity improves our lives in amazing ways, but it must also be respected. Without the proper precautions, electricity can cause serious injuries, fires or even death.

Use lightbulbs rated at the proper wattage for all fixtures in your home or business. Using a higher wattage than the fixture rating will increase brightness, but it can also melt light sockets, damage wire insulation or cause fires.

Never pull plugs out by the cord. This damages the cord, creates a spark and a fire hazard. If you have young children in the house, always put caps on the outlets and don't overload with too many plugs. If the outlet feels hot, you probably have a dangerous fire hazard.

If bread gets stuck in your toaster, always unplug the toaster before



trying to get the toast out. Never use a metal fork to remove toast while it is plugged in.

If you have a garbage disposal, unplug it before pulling anything out and shut off the breaker to be safe.

Water and electricity are dangerous together, so never use electric equipment in wet conditions, and keep devices like cell phones and video games away from plugs and sinks. Keep electrical cords away from sinks and always use dry hands to flip the switch or touch an electric appliance or tool.

# **Getting you back on line**

he first priority in any outage is to get the greatest number of people back on as quickly as possible. So, electric co-ops follow a sequence of repairs to restore power to large groups of consumers

before tackling smaller groups and individual consumers. This fictitious example details a typical repair sequence.

The main distribution line from substation must be fixed before anyone can have power.

Next, repair crews fix the lines that bring power to the greatest number of people in a community.

3 After larger pockets of consumers are back on line, crews fix service lines to individual homes.
